You Will Be Persecuted

During the month of July, we had to deal with many challenges the Lord presented for us. They all related to what the Apostle Paul says in 2 Timothy 3:12, *"In fact, everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted."* For example, three weeks ago Fung talked to a young man in Laos who is currently homeless because he believes in Jesus. In January of this year, Theng returned home after he graduated from college. While in school an Australian missionary shared the Good News with him. Eventually, the Holy Spirit converted him and he became a Christian.

Just before Theng's family was going to celebrate his graduation, he told his parents and siblings that he is now a Christian and also wanted all of them to believe in Jesus. They all got angry with him and kicked him out of the house and the village. They never celebrated his graduation. Currently, he is homeless in Laos, but he is actively witnessing the gospel wherever possible and to whomever he can.

There are many Hmong Christian brothers and sisters currently suffering from persecutions by their own family members, relatives, and/or the local authorities in their country. 

Working in partnership with our Hmong pastors in Southeast Asia, **51 individuals were baptized** in July. One hundred and twelve individuals received catechism instruction. We pray that as more people hear the word of God, there will be more baptisms in August. Please keep our Hmong pastors and evangelists in your prayers as they minister to their members and travel for witnessing to the people in places that may not be safe for them to share the Gospel.
