# The Lutheran Faith

Who are the Lutherans?  
 Lutherans are Christians who believe in the Triune God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We believe that God reveals Himself to us in the pages of the Bible, and that Jesus Christ is our Savior, the one who came into the world to forgive our sins and offer eternal life to us. As Jesus himself said, "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son. That whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal salvation." (John 3:16)

The Lutheran Church is named in honor of Dr. Martin Luther who lived from 1483-1546. Luther was a German monk and priest who saw that the church had become corrupt and was not teaching the Bible truthfully. Luther, with the help of other protestant reformers, emphasized that the church must return to the Biblical truth found in the Old Testament and New Testament. Luther taught that mankind can only be saved by God's mercy shown to us in Jesus Christ, not by our good works. Eventually Martin Luther broke away from and left the Roman Catholic Church, and many Christians throughout Europe followed.
